Week #3. Luke 22:1-6, 7-13, 14-23

Questions¹:

Open:

1. **Think about memorable meals you have experienced.** Can you call to mind a particular important, or deeply meaningful meal of significance? We have time for 2 or three people to share about that meal and why it mattered.

Dig

1. In 22:1 Chief Priests and Scribes are seeking to “get rid of Jesus.” Why? Review Lk.19:28-48
2. Why do the chief priests and scribes need Judas to assist them?
3. Reread 22:3-6. In v.3 Satan enters Judas. In v.6 Judas consented to betray Jesus. So which is it? Can Judas say the Devil made me do it?
4. Besides the desire to share the festival with friends, why do you think Jesus eagerly desires to share this Passover?
5. Jesus words over the bread and wine give new meaning to Passover. Read Jeremiah 31:31-33 and Hebrews 10:11-18 How would you describe the New Covenant Jesus brought about?

Reflect

6. What does sharing in the Lord’s Supper or Holy Communion mean to you?
